8.e. APPROVAL OF THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) FOR THE YOUTH GUIDANCE (YG) BECOMING A MAN (BAM) PROGRAM AT MCKINLEY JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL FOR THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

Youth Guidance's **Becoming A Man program (BAMA®)** is a school-based group counseling program that guides young men in 7th-12th grades to learn, internalize and practice social cognitive skills, make responsible decisions for their future and become positive members of their school and community. BAM integrates clinical theory and practice, men's rites of passage work, and a dynamic approach to youth engagement.

Each session is built around a lesson plan designed to develop a specific skill through stories, role-playing and group exercises. BAM students learn and practice impulse control, emotional self-regulation, recognition of social cues and interpreting intentions of others, raising aspirations for the future and developing a sense of personal responsibility and integrity. Students who participate in BAM are more likely to stay in school, develop healthy relationships, and stay out of the juvenile justice system.

9.a. Board Update - Superintendent Dr. Jerome Ferrell, Jr. stated that there were some exciting things going on during the summer. He thanked Ms. Webb for methodically putting the agenda for Institute Day together. He shared that there were a lot of people who helped and were very hands on like Mrs. Cook and Mrs. Lee-White. He stated that the new backdrop was on display and many people took pictures in front of it. Doctor Ferrell talked about the retreat

for the Administrator's day one at the Harvest Room the District admin presented, and Dr. Ferrell discussed IFACE, (Innovation, Future, Academics, Community and Excellence).

### 10. ADMINISTRATORS' REPORT

10.a. Curriculum and Grants - Ms. Webb, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Grants, stated that expenditure reports were completed up to and through July 31st. He also shared that money was awarded from a kitchen grant that Dr. Morris told him to apply for and that the kitchen at Greenwood has received new equipment.

10.c. Technology - Ms. Lolkema, Director of Technology, stated that Canon Copiers will be replacing server and that the district is going cloud based. If there was any problem with the switch it would on take 48 hours to return to using the server. The purchase of Virtru will be a good program for security in the district. Ms. Lolkema shared that the Google training went well. She also said that Chromebooks would be going out to on the next day to all 6<sup>th</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> grade students, but that the district may need to purchase more for 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

10.d. Office of Specialized Services - Mrs. Kimberly Daniels, Director of Specialized Services, shared that the department was in the process of completing an Internal Audit of Special Education, English Language Learners, and Pre-Kindergarten. Mrs. Daniels also stated that the department was in the process of accessing student needs, out of district needs, and working with Harrisburg to ensure compliance.
